Rules Applying to Dog Shows
Effective January 1, 2010

Chapter 11, Section 1

No dog shall be exhibited in a licensed or member dog show, except for dogs entered in the Miscellaneous Class, unless it is either individually registered in the AKC Stud Book, or individually registered with a foreign registry organization whose pedigrees are acceptable for AKC registration.

Hotel/Dog Show Guidelines

When you sign the show entry form, you automatically agree to the following terms concerning motels. They have been established for the good of all exhibitors and will ensure future use of these facilities.

1. For Maximum dogs per room, contact hotel.
2. Dogs left unattended in a guest room MUST be in a crate. Plastic sheeting MUST be under each crate in the guest room.
3. Hotel guests with dogs in the room need to use the special door identifier provided by the hotel. This identifier will leave instructions to the housekeeping staff. Housekeeping will not enter the room unless the door identifier is present.
4. Housekeeping must be allowed to clean a guest room (with dogs) at least every 2 days. Guests who have special request (e.g. a certain time of the day that room will be vacant) can discuss them with the housekeeping staff upon arrival.
5. Bathing and/or grooming of dogs in or outside the guest room is not allowed.
6. The individual guest will be responsible for any damages to a guest room or any hotel property. This includes, but is not limited to replacement cost of carpeting if odors or stains cannot be removed by traditional cleaning methods.
7. Dogs are to be on leash at all times when out of the guest room.
8. The hotel and the show committee will investigate any problem areas that are outlined above.
9. Extension cords are not allowed to be plugged into rooms from a vehicle, trailer or camper in the parking lot.

Point Values

Point values will be assigned to entrants in competition as follows:

Breed:

- 1 pt. Participation
- 2 pts. Make a cut
- 3 pts. Place 1-4
- 4 pts. RW, Winners, BOB, BOS, AOM

Obedience:

- 1 pt. Participation
- 2 pts. Qualifying Novice Score
- 3 pts. Qualifying Open Score
- 4 pts. Qualifying Utility Score

Rally:

- 1 pt. Participation
- 2 pts. Qualifying Novice Score
- 3 pts. Qualifying Intermediate/Adv. Score
- 4 pts. Qualifying Excellent/Master Score

Agility:

- 1 pt. Participation
- 2 pts. Qualifying Novice Score
- 3 pts. Qualifying Open Score
- 4 pts. Qualifying Excellent/ Master Score

Herding:

- 1 pt. Participation
- 2 pts. HT / PT
- 3 pts. Qualifying Started/ Intermediate Score
- 4 pts. Qualifying Advanced Score

Bonus Point: 1 pt. — Dog competes in ALL 5 venues

Note: Herding Instinct tests are not included in this award and will not be awarded a participation.

Note: 2019 is a test year for Agility Premier and it will not count toward Best All Around Sheltie Points.

Dogs receiving qualifying scores in performance events will be awarded 2, 3, or 4 points as appropriate for their class but do not receive the participation point as well. The Participation point in performance events is awarded only if the dog competes but does not qualify in the event. Dogs competing in multiple classes at the same event will be credited with the highest placement received in any one class.

Dogs that make a cut or earn placements and awards in breed competition will be awarded 2, 3, or 4 points as applicable to the award, but do not receive the participation point as well. Dogs who make multiple cuts in a class will receive the same two points as dogs that make one cut. Dogs excused from the breed ring shall still be awarded a point for participation. Dogs disqualified from the breed ring shall not be awarded a point for participation.

Preferred agility classes are scored equally to the corresponding regular agility class. Non-regular obedience classes are scored as the regular class with similar or next lower difficulty level. For example, Veterans obedience qualifying score is worth 2 pt. because Novice exercises are used. Beginner Novice qualifying score is worth only the one point for participation because exercises are less difficult than Novice. Graduate Novice qualifying score is Worth 2 pt. because it is similar to Novice and less difficult than Open.

Partial points will not be awarded. In the event of a tie, event scores shall be used to break the tie. The dog with the highest total score will receive the award.

The official catalog markings taken from the judges' books, for each event shall be used to determine eligibility, participation, placements and official scores.

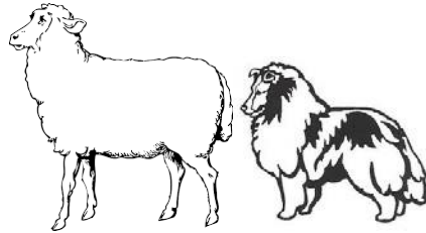
NOTICE TO ALL EXHIBITORS



The AKC will collect a \$3.50 AKC Recording Fee for each entry of a dog in all AKC licensed and member dog shows, obedience trials, and tracking tests. If a dog is entered in more than one class in the show, the Event/Recording Fees will be collected on each entry.

- **Please note: Rally is considered a separate trial from Obedience.**
- At every licensed or member club Rally Trial, a Recording Fee of \$3.50 shall be required for the entry of each dog. (AKC Rally Regulations, Chapter 1, Section 3).
- A show-giving club shall assume the responsibility of collecting all Recording Fees and Event Service Fees for the AKC.
- **Canadian Exhibitors must submit entries with checks drawn on U.S. Accounts or with international money orders in U.S. funds.**
- Dogs need be present only for scheduled judging and will be released if not needed for further judging.
- Dogs must be ready for judging. Neither the club nor its Superintendent will be responsible or obligated to furnish any service for notifying exhibitors or agents of Class Judging. Judges need not wait for any dog holding up a class. Owners or agents alone are responsible for the presence of dogs in the judging rings.
- No Entry will be accepted which specifies any condition as to its acceptance. Telegraph, E-mail and unsigned entries cannot be accepted and will be returned. Entries not on Official AKC Entry Forms, and Photocopies of Entry Forms without the Agreement and Rules on the reverse side are NOT ACCEPTABLE. The club and/or its Superintendent assume no responsibility for wrong or incomplete information given on the entry blank by the owner or the owner's agent. **Responsibility for completeness of any entry rests solely with entrant.**
- Entry fees shall NOT be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, sick, lame, excused by the Judge or Veterinarian, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee, or because it has been entered incorrectly. There is no refund for duplicate entries or overpayments. The Superintendent/Secretary will make every effort to find all duplicate entries, but if entry has been processed, no refund will be made. If, because of riots, civil disturbances or other acts beyond the control of the management it is impossible to open, or to complete the show, NO REFUND will be made.
- **Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry fee.** The Superintendent/Secretary will add a \$25.00 collection fee to the amount of each returned check.
- **Refunds** for cancellations due to judge change or cancellation made prior to entries closing will be mailed to said exhibitor or agent after the show.
- **Entries will be acknowledged** after entries close with entry acknowledgement and judging program to address on entry. Should Exhibitor NOT receive an acknowledgement within a reasonable time, PLEASE notify the Secretary/Superintendent applicable to the specific trial as noted in the premium list.
- **Loss or Damage:** The Show Committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of any accident or misfortune to either dogs or exhibitors participating in these shows. BRIGANDS HIDEOUT - HERDING SITE GENERAL POLICIES AND OTHER INFORMATION

PARKING

- General parking is allowed only in the gravel parking lot. (approx 40 spaces). All exhibitors **MUST** park in the gravel parking lot – **unauthorized vehicles in unapproved parking areas will be fined by Brigands (\$150)**.
- Limited loading and unloading area near the “Ag Bldg” is available – but no general parking.
- There is a limited number of “handicapped spaces.” Only those with the required HC card will be allowed to use those spaces.
- Judges, trial secretary, trial chairperson, stock handlers with dogs, presenters, etc are the only individuals who are permitted to park at the main facility (rather than the gravel parking lot). Only those required to be close to the building, due to their responsibilities, will be allowed to park near the barns. Approved parties will have a designated parking permit from ASSA.

DRIVEWAYS

- Except for the main driveway, all the driveways are single lanes.
- The driveway around the barns must be available/clear at all times for emergency vehicles. [permission may be granted for one vehicle to be parked in the west driveway]
- Drivers/cars heading toward the parking lot have the right-of-way. This means those exiting must back up to allow the other car to continue.

- The safety of dogs is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are able to perform all obstacles safely. Ring size will be 100' x 90'. Agility will be indoors at the Linn County Fair & Expo Center indoor course on packed dirt flooring.
- Conditional, unsigned, incomplete, telephone or telegraph entries cannot be accepted. Entries must be on Official AKC Entry forms or photocopy with agreement and rules on back.
- Express mail entries must include signature permitting them to be left at the secretary's address without recipient's signature.
- Owners are responsible for all errors on entry forms and no entry fee will be refunded in the event of such errors or cancellation of entries after the published closing date.
- Entry fees will not be refunded if the dog is absent, disqualified, excused or barred from competition by action of the trial committee. If, because of riots, civil disturbances or other acts beyond the control of the management, it is impossible to open or complete the show, no refund or entry fees will be made.

- Sportsmen refuse to compromise their commitment and obligation to the sport of purebred dogs by injecting personal advantage or consideration into their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsman judge judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsman judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsman exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsman exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- The sportsman respects the AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies governing the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen find that vigorous competition and civility are not inconsistent and are able to appreciate the merit of their competition and the effort of competitors.
- Sportsmen welcome, encourage and support newcomers to the sport.
- Sportsmen will deal fairly with all those who trade with them.
- Sportsmen are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportsmen spurn any opportunity to take personal advantage of positions offered or bestowed upon them.
- Sportsmen always consider as paramount the welfare of their dog.
- Sportsmen refuse to embarrass the sport, the American Kennel Club, or themselves while taking part in the sport.
